Sean J. Rogers is an attorney specializing labor and employment law for more than 40 years. His practice is exclusively as arbitrator and mediator. He serves as the Alexandria City Labor Relations Administrator and the Montgomery County Housing Opportunities Commission Labor Relations Administrator.

He is member of the National Academy of Arbitrators and the National Academy of Distinguished Neutrals. His arbitration-mediation practice encompasses the Federal, Public and Private sectors of labor relations, and commercial arbitration and mediation as well. He devotes significant time to *pro bono* legal work, including serving as a mediator with the DC Bar Attorney-Client Arbitration Board and past Chair of the St. Mary's County Ethics Commission. He served as the NAA DC Coordinator. He was past President, Vice-President and Treasurer of the Society of Federal Labor and Employee Relations Professional (SFLERP), DC Chapter. He is a member of the SFLERP National Executive Board.

He was Senior Hearing Officer/Senior Counsel with the National Mediation Board (NMB), the statutory-neutral federal agency responsible for facilitating labor relations in the airline and railroad industries. At the NMB, he also served as the Administrator of the Center for Advanced Study of Law and Dispute Resolution Process at George Mason University School of Law, a multi-discipline, academic forum. He was also a GMUSL Professor of Law and Conflict Resolution.

He has experience as not only a chief-legal officer and negotiator for national labor organizations, but also director of labor relations and chief negotiator for a major county government and a large federal agency. He was the National Director, Labor Relations, for the Internal Revenue Service ('95-'98). He was Director of Planning and Policy for the Montgomery County Government ('86-'95). His work for labor unions includes: National Counsel, National Treasury Employees Union ('78-'85) and Associate General Counsel, National Association of Government Employees/International Brotherhood of Police Officers ('74-'78). From '70-'74, he served as a police officer with the Metropolitan Police, District of Columbia.
