The Black Heritage Trail

This 1.6 mile, 90 minute tour is run by the National Park Service at no charge. During the time between 1783, when Massachusetts outlawed slavery and the end of the Civil War, Beacon Hill housed more than half of Boston's African American population. It was also the heart of the City's abolition movement and the Underground Railroad. The tour will stop at many of the houses, schools, churches, and meeting places from that era and includes historical commentary.

The Embrace
