She has also counseled Postal Service management on a variety of employment law matters involving Title VII, Age Discrimination Employment Act (ADEA), Rehabilitation Act, Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA), Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), and Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) compliance, as well as non-employment law issues such as compliance with Touhy regulations, Freedom of Information Act, Privacy Act, and implementation and compliance with Postal Service regulations concerning delivery and related service issues.

Jennifer has been promoted several times through the Postal Service Law Department and is a graduate of the Postal Service Managerial Leadership, Executive Foundations, and Executive Leadership Programs.
