

ARTHUR M. LUBY

Arthur Luby received his B.A. from Brown University in 1975 and his J.D. from the University of Michigan in 1979. From 1980 to 1981, Mr. Luby was Labor Counsel for the U.S. Senate Labor and Human Resources Committee. In 1981, Mr. Luby joined the Washington, DC, law firm of O'Donnell, Schwartz, and Anderson where he became a partner in 1984. In 2005 Mr. Luby joined the Air Line Pilots Association as a Senior Contract Administrator, and in 2006 became an Assistant Director in the Representation Department. In 2022 Mr. Luby became Senior Advisor and Assistant Director.

Prior to coming to ALPA, Mr. Luby was negotiating counsel for all three pilot contracts negotiated by the Independent Pilots Association with United Parcel Service, as well as the first pilot contract with Continental Airlines after the pilots at that carrier reorganized their union. In addition, he was counsel to the Transport Workers Union in the negotiations which led to four collective bargaining agreements with American Airlines covering its ground personnel, and two with Southwest, covering flight attendants and ramp personnel. He was lead counsel in five different interest arbitrations over the terms of collective bargaining agreements between the American Postal Workers Union and the United States Postal Service, and was also counsel for the APWU in litigation and rights arbitration throughout his tenure at his law firm.

Since taking his position at ALPA, Mr. Luby has been directly involved as lead counsel in negotiating agreements at ASTAR, Spirit, United Airlines, JetBlue, and, most recently, the newly ratified agreement between ALPA and Delta Airlines
