Margie has been a full-time labor and employment arbitrator and mediator since 1990. She was President of the National Academy of Arbitrators in 2016-2017.

Her current permanent panel appointments include the National Women's Soccer League and the National Women's Soccer League Players' Association (sole arbitrator); Major League Baseball and the Major League Baseball Players Association; American Airlines and the APFA and APA; United Airlines and IBT; Southwest Airlines and the TWU and SWAPA; Jet Blue and ALPA; United Parcel Service and IBT (National Panel); the Fair Food Program and the Immokalee Workers; Amtrak and the FOP; Disneyland and the SPFPA; United Postal Service and the American Postal Workers Union and the National Postal Mail Handlers Union -- RI-399 National Arbitrator.
