THEODORE J. ST. ANTOINE

Theodore J. (Ted) St. Antoine is the James E. & Sarah A. Degan Professor Emeritus of Law at the University of Michigan. After practicing labor law in Washington, D.C. with Woll, Mayer & St. Antoine, he joined the Michigan law faculty in 1965. He served as Dean of the Law School in 1971-78. St. Antoine has been a labor arbitrator for over 50 years and was President of the National Academy of Arbitrators in 1999-2000. In addition to a standard labor law casebook and other publications, he edited the NAA's The Common Law of the Workplace: The Views of Arbitrators (1998, 2005) and NAA, A Quarter Century of New Directions in Leadership and Mission (2022). Past positions include Secretary and Council member of the ABA Labor Law Section and Chair of the Michigan Bar's Labor Law Section. St. Antoine has been on the American Arbitration Association Board of Directors and received its George W. Taylor Award for his contributions to collective bargaining. He drafted the Uniform Law Commissioners' Model Employment Termination Act. St. Antoine was Chair of the Michigan Attorney Discipline Board, Chair of the UAW-GM Legal Services Plan, and Chair of the UAW's Public Review Board. He is a member of the American Bar Foundation and the College of Labor and Employment Lawyers.
