

[Caroline Mandell](#) is a legal communication and litigation consultant based in Toronto. She teaches basic and advanced decision writing to judges and adjudicators across Canada. She also works with litigators on how to craft a winning argument and—the trickiest part—how to communicate it to the court. From 2007-2017, she was counsel to the judges of the Court of Appeal for Ontario. She has a JD and an MA from the University of Toronto and was called to the Ontario bar in 2005.
