Margie has been a full-time labor and employment arbitrator and mediator since 1990. She was President of the National Academy of Arbitrators in 2016-2017. Her current permanent panel appointments include Major League Baseball and the Major League Baseball Players Association; American Airlines and APFA and APA; United Airlines and IBT; Southwest Airlines and TWU; United Parcel Service and IBT (National Panel); AMTRAK and the FOP; WMATA and ATU L689; the Fair Food Program and the Immokalee Workers; and various school district panels. Previously, Margie was a field attorney at the National Labor Relations Board in Philadelphia. She received her J.D. from Villanova University, and her B.A. from St. Joseph's University. Margie has been an adjunct lecturer in Labor and Employment Law courses at the University of California, Berkeley, School of Law, as well as St. Joseph's University, Philadelphia, PA. She has participated in the development of training programs for new arbitrators and advocates for the AAA, FMCS, NAA and other organizations, and conducts training throughout the country. She was past-President of the Philadelphia Chapter of the Labor and Employment Relations Association (formerly IRRA.) In 2016, Margie was the recipient of the Peggy Browning Award.
